

Trobabes' Mile Quartet Sizzles, Varsity Drags

Although three prize performers were sidelined by injuries, USC's national championship track team rolled to an 86-50 victory over Washington State before a "crowd" of 857 at the Coliseum Saturday forenoon.

It was the first AAWU dual meet ever staged between the schools, so all winning performances became records.

The Cougars lacked depth

might Trojans in first place and early-season conditioning yet almost matched the Cougars, bagging eight out of 17, including a disqualification gift in the mile relay.

Fresh Steal Show

In a simultaneous meet, the USC Frosh whipped Long Beach City College, 90-42, and actually stole the show by beating both varsities in the combined mile relay which closed the competition.

The Trobabe combine of Hutch Gibb, Wendell Cox, Dave Buck and Dennis Carr was clocked in 3:16.7, as compared to 3:19.2 for a makeshift Trojan varsity team and 3:19.4 for the Cougars. Adding insult to injured feelings, Troy's varsity then was disqualified.

1:50.8 for Carr

Carr, who earlier had set a school freshmen record of 1:50.8 in the 880, contributed a 48.5 anchor lap in that baton race.

Auguring very well for USC's future in the half, sophomore Bruce Bess came through with a 1:50.7, and junior Chris Johnson, a 1:50.9.

Two varsity performers scored doubles. Dave Morris of the Trojans took the 100 in 9.8 and the 220 in 21.6. He also scooted on the victor-

ious 440 relay foursome. John Valiant of the Cougars accomplished an Iron Man job by taking the mile in 4:10.7 and the 2-mile in 9:10.4.

Troy's Wellesley Clayton again reached the 25 foot category in the broadjump. He won with 25-1 and also did 25-0 1/4.

USC's Larry Stuart scratched from the javelin throw, Mahoney Samuels from the triple jump and Dick Cortese from the 100, 220 and mile relay after participating in the 440 relay.

Jim Allen, Washington State's world-class hurdler, skipped both barrier events because of leg trouble but finished second in the 440 and anchored the mile relay team despite heavy bandaging of his thigh.
