

USC Wins Big Six Title; UCLA's Day Upset

Scoring in every event but the concluding mile relay, USC maintained its AAWU track and field monopoly Saturday afternoon at the Coliseum.

Though several of Vern Wolfe's performers failed to produce as anticipated, the Trojans scored 73 points, as compared to 41 for California, 40 for Washington State, 37 for Stanford, 33 for Washington and 16 for UCLA.

Attendance didn't quite come up to that at Hollywood Park and Dodger Stadium, totaling only 1,826.

The feature event of the program, the mile run, resulted in defeat for UCLA's Bob Day. In fact, the previously sensational Bruin sophomore was forced to settle for fourth place.

He led going into the

stretch, but came up empty as three runners drove past to post times better than the listed meet record. Stanford's Paul Schlicke won in 4:02.5, with USC's Bruce Bess second and Washington State's John Vallant third as both were clocked in lifetime bests of 4:02.7.

Because of bush-league meet management, which provided only three times though five places counted points, there was no official clocking for Day. Unofficially, he did 4:03.5. Earlier this season, he was credited with 4:01.8.

The meet mark that tumbled was 4:03, established last year by Troy's Julio Marin.

Four other records fell as the Big Six staged its final championships before becoming the Big Eight, the Pacific Coast Conference II

or whatever it will be called after Oregon and Oregon State join up July 1.

Bill Self of Washington State vaulted 15-9½. Wariboko Q. West of Washington long-jumped 24-11½. Dave Archibald of California galloped the quarter in 46.3. And the Golden Bear mile relay combine of Al Courchesne, Dave Fishback, Forrest Beaty and Archibald did 3:11.0.

Archibald not only obliterated the meet standard, but ran the fastest 440 in Coliseum history.

As for Trojan disappointments, Mike Flanagan finished fourth in the vault, Wellesley Clayton third in the long jump, Lew Hoyt fifth in the high jump, Larry Stuart fourth in the javelin, Chris Johnson fifth in the 880, and the mile relay team finished dead last.
