

# LONG TOPS OWN SHOT-PUT RECORD WITH 66-3½ EFFORT

The greatest shot put "war" of all time erupted in the SPAAU track and field championships at Occidental Friday night.

Dallas Long of the Pasadena Athletic Assn. again shattered his listed world record with a heave of 66 ft. 3½ in.

Next came former record holder Parry O'Brien and John McGrath, also repre-

senting the PAA, both with lifetime bests of 63-10 and 62-6¾, respectively.

Two others likewise surpassed 60 ft., Dave Davis of the Camp Pendleton Marines doing 61-5½ and Don Castle of USC joining the elite for the first time with 60-9¾.

Long's recognized mark is 65-10½, achieved in 1962. Earlier this year, he reached 65-11½, then followed with a prodigious 66-7¼ put at Fresno three weeks ago. But

the Fresno ring lacked a raised rim, as required by international rules and hence isn't likely to be accepted.

All conditions were satisfactory Friday, so this latest "Big One" by the 23-year-old USC dental student will be submitted with apparent certainty of becoming the new official record.

The mile run produced the most fireworks on the track.

Ron Morris of the Striders, after vaulting 16-3 3/4, tried 16-7, but it was no go. Another Morris, Dave of USC, captured both sprints with bursts of 9.5 and 21.1.

### Day Sets Mark

UCLA's outstanding sophomore runner, Bob Day, not only whipped USC's Bruce Bess in the 880, but shattered a meet record set in 1954 by Mal Whitfield, who had won Olympic Games gold medals in '48 and '52. Whitfield's SPAAU standard was 1:50.4, while Day came home in 1:50.3. Bess took second with 1:50.8.

Altogether, eight meet records fell.

The attendance was 3,250.

### Can Do Better

Long's shot series was 65-1½ foul, 66-3½, foul, 64-0½ and 64-4.

Afterward, Dallas said of his record put, "It didn't feel that good. I think I can do better. In fact, I thought that last one would be longer."

O'Brien, whose 63-5 in 1960 set a world mark at that time was profuse in his praise of Long.
