

PAIR TIED AFTER 5,000 METER RUN

EUGENE, Ore.—Add this one to the unbelievable!

After 5000 meters of running, Jim Murphy of the Air Force Academy and Bill Straub of the Army tied for first here Friday in the NCAA meet record time of 14:12.3.

Judges, after viewing negatives of the finish, announced they would try to break the tie today when they look at the prints.

With a warm sun smiling on the athletes, the record-breaking tempo increased Friday with the American 100-meter mark twice tied and three new NCAA figures posted.

Sprint Marks

Trenton Jackson of Illinois and Harry Jerome, a Canadian running for Oregon, sped to 10.1 second clockings in the two semifinal heats of the short dash.

These four joined Arizona's Gayle Hopkins in the meet record shattering department. The 164 pound long jumper leaped 26 feet 9¼ inches to erase a mark set by Greg Bell of Indiana at 26 feet 7 inches, seven years ago at Austin, Tex.

Murphy and Straub battled neck and neck for the last 50 yd. of the grueling 5,000 as they hit the tape together to clip seven and a half seconds off the mark posted by Al Lawrence of Houston in 1960.

As the meet progressed to today's finals, it seemed evident that Oregon would walk away with the team title just as the Webfoots did here two years ago.

Fresno State, San Jose State and North Carolina College are expected to battle it out for second place honors.

Charles Craig kept Fresno State in contention by taking the leadership in the preliminaries of the triple jump with a leap of 51 feet 8¾ inches.

This exceeded the old record but failed like two other sterling performances in gaining recognition because they were wind aided.

Bob Hayes and Ed Roberts were the other two who were deprived of NCAA records because the

following wind in the 200-meter dash was slightly over the allowable 4:37 mph.

In winning their semi-final heat in the identical times of 20.3 seconds, they missed a chance to slip two-tenths off Henry Carr's record set at Albuquerque last year. Carr is sitting this one out, but will show up for the AAU meet next weekend at Rutgers.

Southern California's chances of a successful defense of its team title ran into all sorts of trouble.

Lots of Flops

Dave Morris ran fifth in the 100-meters and failed to qualify. Larry Stuart, with a negligible effort of 216 feet 11½ inches made on his last throw was just able to qualify seventh among the javelin throwers. Les Tipton of Oregon had a best of 249 feet 10½ inches to lead.

In the shot put Don Castle qualified fifth with a toss of 58 feet 6 inches, as the New York strong man, Gary Gubner, set the pace with a 61 feet 1¼ inch effort.

Wellesley Clayton managed to get the Trojans on the scoring board with his 25 foot ¾ inch long jump leap which was good enough for fourth and four points.

Underwood Disqualified

Troy's only bright spot on the running track came in the first heat of the 800-meter semifinals which Bruce Bess won in the day's best time of 1:49. Theo Viltz of USC also qualified for the high hurdle finals.

One of the top half mile favorites, Jan Underwood of Oregon State, was disqualified in this heat for cutting in.

Another top star was lost from the 400-meter hurdle finals when Jim Allen of Washington State reinjured his leg and pulled up after the first barrier in the fastest heat which Andrew McCray of North Carolina College won in 50.8.

Ron Whitney of Occidental missed his stride on the last two hurdles of the second heat and failed to qualify. His time was 51.7.

Finals are on tap today in 16 events.
