

Two meet records tumbled and a third was equaled Saturday as USC's tough track team scored an expected victory over California in the Coliseum, 81-64. Attendance was 1 280

Dwight Middleton of the Trojans, running the 440 for the first time this season, noi only upset the Bears' great Dave Archibald, but tied the meet mark of 47.0 in the process. Ar c h ib al d, whose career best is 46.3, was slightly hampered by a leg injury and had to accept a 47.1.

Troy's Mahoney Samuels obiliterated the triple jump record as he soared 49-10 even though taking off a couple of feet back of the board. The old mark was 47-2 1/4, set last year by Cal's Bruce Ballmer.

Relay Victory

The Bears' terrific mile relay combine of Al Courchesne, Dave Fishback, Forrest Beaty and Archibald lowered its own meet record from 3:12.9 a year ago to 3:10.8. USC likewise bettered the former standard by clicking off a 3:12.7.

Middleton b e c a m e the fourth Trojan to do 47.0 in the 440 against Cal. Jim Lea did it in 1954. Ted Smith in 1958 and Bobby Staten in 1959. Dwight tried the 220 later in the afternoon, but pulled up with a leg cramp 20 yards from the finish, just when he appeared likely to overhaul Beaty.

Middleton Surprises

Against Stanford last week, Middleton tied up in both sprints — which made his 440 victory Saturday all the more surprising. Beaty captured both

dashes to share doubling honors with USC's Paul Kerry, who took both hurdles races. Beaty also anchored the winning 440 relay crew. A large upset materialized's Don Schmidt bested Troy's Gary Carlsen. Schmidt did 172-10½, his best of the year. for 166-9½ after having twirled the platter 181-5½ earlier in the campaign.

Two "preliminary" boys almost stole the show as Santa Ana JC defeated the Trojan frosh, 85-57.

Fred Kuller of Santa Ana won both sprints and anchored the Dons' victorious 440 relay team and his 100 time of 9.8 shaded Beaty's 9.9 in the varsity event. Chuck (Peanuts) Schulz of the Trobabes led the combined varsity-frosh field to the wire in the two-mile grind. His time of 9:07.2 set a new USC freshman record, erasing the 9:08.8 achieved by Bruce Bess in 1963
