

WORLD 440, TWO-MILE RELAY RECORDS BROKEN AT FRESNO

FRESNO — A flock of track and field records, including two world marks, suddenly became trash Saturday night when contestants in the 39th annual west coast relays went wild in mass fashion.

As 12,500 spectators spent most of the balmy evening on their feet cheering, Stanford set a world 440-yard relay record of 39.7 and Oklahoma State reduced the world 2-mile relay standard to 7:18.4.

Moreover, UCLA established an American distance medley relay clocking of 9:33.9, Gerry Lindgren of Washington State cut 13.3 seconds off the national freshman 2-mile record by doing 8:40.1 and national junior college marks materialized in the 120 hurdles, vault and shot.

There's a lot more.

Stanford's Larry Questad came from behind to nip favored Darel Newman of Fresno State in the 100 as both did 9.3, Ed Caruthers

of Santa Ana college high-jumped 7 feet $\frac{1}{4}$ inch and the national JC 100 mark was equalled.

Meet marks, of course, tumbled in wholesale fashion.

Eric Frische, Dale Rubin, Bob McIntyre and Questad comprised the Stanford 440 combine, which clipped two-tenths off the world's best of

39.9 set by an Australian national team in 1964.

The Indians also shattered the American and national collegiate records of 40 flat.

Oklahoma State's record foursome consisted of Jimmie Metcalf, Tom Van Ruden and twins John and Dave Perry. The Staters obliterated the combined

world, American and national collegiate standard of 7:19 set by Oregon in 1962 and equalled by Villanova in '64.

The unofficial splits were 1:50 for Metcalf, 1:47.5 for John Perry, 1:49.2 for Von Ruden and 1:51.0 for Dave Perry.

Bob Day was the big noise as the Bruins ran the fastest distance medley race of all time. Day's anchor mile was timed in 3:58.4.

13.6 for Shy

Mt. San Antonio athletes accounted for two of the new JC records as Don Shy sped the 120 hurdles in 13.6 and Bob Seagren cleared 16-0 $\frac{1}{4}$ in the vault. Steve Fite of Chaffey bagged the third by putting the shot 60-8 $\frac{1}{2}$.

Fred Kuller of Santa Ana did 9.3 to tie the JC 100 mark (and match the times of Questad and Newman).

Other fine performances included a 46.2 quarter by Ullis Williams of Arizona State and a 51.2 by Larry Godfrey of San Diego State in the 440 hurdles.

After a prolonged post-meet hassle, Brigham Young was declared the team champion with 32 points, followed by USC and San Jose State with 31. Santa Ana, with 37 points, was undisputed king of the Jaysees.
