

# Lindgren Clocks 'Fastest' Six-Mile

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**BAKERSFIELD**—Amazing Gerry Lindgren ran the fastest six mile ever for a collegian Friday night when he lapped the entire field to win the USTFF distance grind in the remarkable time of 28:21.7.

In what will be his last race this year unless the way is cleared for him to compete in the National AAU championships two weeks hence, the 19-year-old Washington State freshman took 54.1 seconds off the meet mark posted by John Macy of Houston in 1963.

It was 14.1 seconds better than the NCAA record set by Al Lawrence of Houston five years ago but Lindgren will not get credit for a collegiate mark since he's still a freshman.

## Lapped 'em All

Gerry's great race, in which he had lapped every other starter with the race only half run, was the fourth meet mark of the evening.

Sharing the spotlight with him in this department was lanky Tommy Smith of San Jose State who clipped four-tenths off the 220-yard record with a 20.9 performance running into a 6.8 mile wind going into the tape, as he swept past IC4A champion Earl Horner of Villanova.

After eight events San Jose State held the team lead with 41 points. UCLA, lumping its freshmen into the Bruin Track Club, stood second with 24 points. Abilene Christian had 24 and defending champion USC had 22.

## Off Fast

Just as he did in the dual meet with the USSR at Los Angeles last summer, Lindgren stop the show on this breezy night as he went out

the three mile in 13:54.5, which was only two seconds slower than the Federation meet record for that distance.

To give you some idea of his performance, the American record by Ron Larrieu is 27:54; and Ron Clarke's world mark is 27:17.5.

The wholesale revision of marks started early.

IC4A champion Larry Livers of Villanova turned in the first one in the running events when he raced over the 440-yard hurdles in 51 flat to clip three-tenths off the 1963 mark posted by Bill Hardin.

Vance Peterson of Occidental ran shoulder to shoulder with Livers going to the last barrier but missed his step there and fell back into second place. He still bettered the old mark with a 51.1 clocking.

## Mighty Heave

Bill Corsetti of Northeastern (Mass.) college got into the act by boosting the hammer throw record up 10 feet with a 192-3 winning toss.

UCLA's Bob Day gave indication of a probably sub-four minute mile today when he loafed through his trial heat in 4:08.9 without drawing a long breath.
