Trojans of Southern California swamped Washington, 107-38, Saturday in a dual track and field meet that saw six meet records set—five of them by USC.

The Trojans won 14 of

the 17 events in handing the host Huskies their meet.
The bright spot of the

day for Washington was Al Pemberton's 186-4½ discus heave that set a meet, stadium and school record.

Paul Kerry, the NCAA champion hurdler, was the only double winner of the day, taking firsts for the Trojans in the 120 high hurdles and the 440 intermediate hurdles. Southern Cal's John
