Mt. Sac Relays Without Hero, but Still a Star-Studded Show

It was an all-star show without a real star.

The eighth annual Mt. San Antonio Relays Saturday failed to produce a world record, or even an American record. Yet, the 10,000 fans saw a profusion of fine performances.

Item: Art Walker of the Striders triple-jumped 53 feet 10 1/4 inches, best in the world this year and the second longest ever by an American.

Tom Farrell, former St. John's College runner competing unattached, sped the 880 in 1:47.9, equalling the fastest time of 1966 posted recently by USC's Dennis Carr.

Tommie Smith of San Jose State unleashed fantastic anchor legs in the 440 and 880 relays. He just failed to give the Spartans victory in the 440 after making up eight yards on the Striders' Larry Dunn, then was clocked in 20 flat as he "lost" Fred Kuller of the Striders and Art Carter of New Mexico in the last 40 yards to turn a three-way 880 fight into a 10yard triumph.

John Pennel of the Striders and Sam Kirk of the Pasadena AA vaulted 17 feet, but were thwarted trying 17-5 for a world mark.

Ralph Boston of the Striders longjumped 26-4 1/4, but was pressed by Gayle Hopkins of the Pasadena AA, who did 26-2 3/4.

Jim Grelle and George Young got identical clocking. of 14:10.8 in the 5,000, though a Polaroid photo plain-Please Turn to Page 4, Col. 2

USC's Gary Carlsen got off the best discus throw of his young life - 195-032 -to beat three-time Olympic champion Al Oerter, whose best Saturday was 194-8.

Walker and Smith were chosen the athletes of the meet.

The vault, long jump, 880 and triple jump winners made the meet record book.

Dyrol Burleson ran away with the mile in 4:01.4 as Grelle switched to the 5,000 and Olympic 5,000 champion Bob Schul finished dead last in the mile.

The Southland's two freshman sprinting sensations came through as advertised, USC's Lennox Miller took the 100-meter race in 10.3, with UCLA's Harold Busby second in 10.4. Miller didn't run the 220, but Busby took over with a 21 flat.

Ron Whitney, disqualified for two false starts in the 440 hurdles, pulled a funny. He stood in his lane and when the gun sounded, took off and won. It didn't count, of course,
