

BRUINS QUALIFY 13 AS USC TRACK STARS ON SIDELINES

STANFORD — It was black-and-blue Friday for USC as the AAUW track championships got under way in ideal weather on a fast track.

It was peaches-and-cream Friday for UCLA, which can lose today only by forgetting to show up.

The Trojans made the fabled one-hoss-shay look like a futuristic model by comparison.

NCAA high hurdles champion Paul Kerry, NCAA pole vault champion Bill Fosdick and sprinter Steve Firenze didn't even make the trip because of assorted miseries.

But that was just a starter.

Dwight Middleton, slowed almost to a walk by a hamstring pull, failed to qualify in the 100 and 220. Mahoney Samuels, also hurting, missed making the triple jump finals. Ditto for Randy Beardslee in the long jump.

Moreover, discus thrower Gary Carlsen stood only third after the preliminaries.

In the nine events in which trials were held, USC qualified only seven. And UCLA?

Thirteen Bruins

The Bruins put 13 performers into the finals, including Dick Selby, who is leading in the javelin throw; Doug Olmstead, leading in the triple jump; and Bob Frey and Tom Jones, who equaled the meet record of 21.0 in winning their 220 heats.

The Bruins also scored one point when Dick Weeks finished fifth in the 3,000 meter steeplechase, the day's only final. USC had no entries in that event.

Further boosting Bruin stock, Bob Day insists that he'll run in today's mile race, heel injury notwithstanding. Coach Jim Bush, however, may keep him on the sidelines.

Another meet mark was tied in the 100, when the Stanford pair of Donn Forbes and Larry Questad did 9.6.

A meet mark materialized in the steeplechase when Oregon's Ken Moore ran 8:49.4, breaking his

own 1965 record time of 9:05.1.

The performances of Middleton and Samuels were pathetic to behold.

Middleton, with season bests of 9.6 and 21.0, finished last in both his heats Friday, being clocked in 10.1 and 21.9. Samuels, going into action with a season best of 52-2½, could do only 49-9½ in two leaps as defending champion, then gave up and passed on his final turn.

The day's other major disappointments were the failure of Oregon's Wade Bell to qualify in the 880 and UCLA's bad-armed Egil Sundbye in the javelin. Defending 100 yard champion Dick Hickman of Washington State scratched because of an injury.
