

# Jones Paces Bruins to Easy Victory in AAWU Track

STANFORD—Jim Bush and his UCLA tracksters achieved the second of two 1966 goals Saturday.

The Bruins, who recently scored a first-in-history win over USC, captured the AAWU championship—and in very emphatic fashion.

They tallied 80 points, while second place USC could amass only 44. Defending champion Oregon got 37, Stanford 32, California and Oregon State 21, Washington State 20 and Washington 15.

UCLA's remaining target is the NCAA title, which will be determined at Indiana U. June 16-17-18.

## Second Crown

In grabbing the school's second league championship—the first came in the old Pacific Coast Conference 10 years ago — the Bruins scored in every event but the long jump and mile. The mile blank resulted because Bush elected to keep national collegiate record holder Bob Day on the sidelines, though that injured athlete wanted to run.

UCLA won nine events, set five meet records, equaled another. The big blow was a 1-2-3 finish in the 220.

Tom Jones, 21-year-old junior from Madera, who transferred to Westwood

from Reedley JC in 1965, was the team's top performer.

He won the 100 in 9.5, a meet record; won the 220 in 21.0, tying the meet record; ran on the 440 relay combine which set a meet record of 40.3; and ran on the mile relay combine which set a meet record of 3:09.3.

## Strong Headwinds

In both sprints, Jones ran into strong headwinds.

However the 6,000 fans, who sat in sunny but windy weather, reserved most of their cheers for little Gerry Lindgren of Washington State. Lindgren clipped 32.2 seconds off the meet three mile mark as he clocked 13:12.8, but that time was well behind his recent 12:53, which established an American and NCAA standard.

Altogether, seven meet records tumbled and another was tied.
