

# Would You Believe, UCLA 86, USC 59?

It wasn't even close.

A UCLA track team that may well go all the way to the national championship soundly thrashed USC, 86-59, at the Coliseum Saturday afternoon before 9,971 cash customers, plus TV viewers.

So the Bruins own their first victory in 34 encounters with the Trojans extending back to 1934—a nice chaser for the school's first Rose Bowl triumph last New Year's Day.

Jim Bush's boys captured 11 of the 17 events, but still had enough energy left to carry him and assistant coach Ken Shannon off the field at the finish.

Troy salvaged some consolation in the companion freshman meet, which the Trobables won, 96-48, after losing five straight years.

Moreover, USC's great yearling vaulter, Paul Wilson, upped his national freshman record from 16 feet 8 inches to 17-1 and barely missed on his last try at 17-4½ which would have broken the world record of 17-4.

## Crippled Trojans

The UCLA varsity probably would have won anyhow, but it was a crippled USC squad that vainly tried for an upset. The Trojans were hurting before the program ever started, then accumulated more miseries during the competition.

NCAA vault champion Bill Fosdick and sprinter Steve Firenze sat it out. NCAA high hurdles king Paul Kerry, bruised in a recent spill, finished third in that event. Mahoney Samuels stood second in the triple jump when his gimpy leg forced him to quit. Dave Buck pulled up in the 880 as did Hutch Gibb in the mile relay.

With victory beckoning, Bush held Norm Jackson out of the 220 because he was stiffening up and Bob Day out of the two mile to save him for Friday night's Coliseum Relays.

## Seven Records Fall

Seven varsity meet records tumbled.

The Bruin 440 relay combine did 40.1, Marc Savage vaulted 16-1, Day ran the mile in 4:00.2 and Bob Frey achieved a 46.5 clocking the 440.

Trojans who helped rewrite the book were Dennis Carr, 1:49.0 in the 880; Dwight Middleton, 21 flat in the 220; and Greg Heet, 6-10 1/4 in the high jump.

Middleton also took the 100 in 9.7 to become the day's only double winner.

The biggest upset was Kerry's third place finish in the 120 highs, behind UCLA's Ron Copeland,

whose time was 14.2, Earl McCullouch of the Trojans was second in 14.3 while Kerry could do only 14.5.

Another surprise came in the mile where Geoff Pyne of UCLA finished fourth. He had been expected to take second behind Day, as he did in 1965, but Bruce Bess (4:02.0) and John Link (4:02.2) of USC beat him out. Pyne's time was 4:04.2.

However, the little New Zealander came back to bag the two miler in Day's absence.

Coach Bush, who celebrated by going on his honeymoon Saturday night, tabbed three events as key numbers—the 440 relay, the 440 dash and the high hurdles.

Two Bruin varsity school records were set as Dick Selby wafted the javelin 247-11 — UCLA swept that event — and Frey did his 46.5 quarter.

The frosh dash duel between Trobabe Lennox Miller and Brubabe Harold Busby produced two impressive wins for the former. Lennox took the 100 in 9.7 against the wind to equal the meet mark and then ripped off the 220 in 20.6 to shatter the Coliseum record of 20.7 held by Paul Drayton. Busby's clockings were 9.9 and 20.7.
