

Bruins, Trojans Romp in Rain

The Bruins and the Trojans continued on collision course for their track and field titanic May 6, but rain, wind and cold prevented Saturday's results from giving any conclusive comparisons.

Coach Jim Bush's national champion UCLA team won 16 of 17 events to drub Stanford, 115-28, in the morning and then coach Vern Wolfe's USC powerhouse tripped Washington, 95-49, in a rain-delayed afternoon meet.

The most excitement occurred following the UCLA meet when Bruin vaulters Dick Railsback and Rick Sloan unofficially joined the 17 foot club. Both officially had 16-6 3/4, best in their careers, but missed three times at 17-1.

On a fourth try, Sloan soared over and Railsback missed. Sloan moved the bar up to 17-4 and missed, but Railsback cleared the height, only 1 1/2 inches under the world record.

The Trojan vault twins, Bob Seagren and Paul Wilson, did 16-6 3/4 and 16-0.

Iron-Man Walsh

Two impressive individual performances saved the day for the visiting teams.

Stanford's Bud Walsh scored 11 of his team's 28 points with a win (Stanford's only one) in the long jump and seconds in the high and intermediate hurdles.

Washington's Dave Williams, a bow-legged giant who will play professional football with the St. Louis Cardinals, scored 10 1/2 points, placing in four events in addition to running an impressive 48.5 non-scoring 440 in the mile relay.

These are the significant events that may have bearing on the USC-UCLA clash:

Sprinters Harold Busby of UCLA and Fred Kuller of USC were impressive after 50-50 starts this spring. Busby, who did not compete last week, won the 100 in 9.6 and ran on both winning relay teams. Kuller upset teammate Lennox Miller in a 21.1 220, looking like the sprinter of 1965 who set national JC records at Santa Ana.

46.7 for Demansky

Don Demansky, a bulldog of a runner from Canada, looked like he's ready for anyone — including even Tommie Smith — with a 46.7 quarter-mile. He followed it up with a 21.2 220 to become UCLA's only double winner.

Gerald Lee triple jumped 51 feet 9 inches for a UCLA school record, erasing the 50-11 1/4 mark by Kermit Alexander which won the 1962 NCAA title. The leap, bettered only twice by collegians last year, was made during a gusty wind, but UCLA officials said they considered it a crosswind and OK'd the record. It was 21 inches better than his best previous, made last year at Pierce JC.

The two-mile experiment by Dennis Carr, which produced a near school record 8:52.2 last week, flopped dismally when the Trojan senior floundered to a third place

9:25.2. Carr sped through an unrealistic 62.2 second lap to open up a big lead, but was going nowhere at the finish while Washington's John Celms won in 9:06.4 and USC's little Chuck Schultz took second in 9:12.4.

Trojan fans in the shivering crowd of 1,127 nearly had heart failure when Earl McCullough sprawled to the cinders in the 440 relay, after colliding with a waiting Husky runner. However, after the meet was delayed one hour, 20 minutes by a sudden cloudburst, Earl the Pearl returned and showed no ill effects as he raced through the mud in 14.0 for the high hurdles and then ran a 10 flat 100.
