

NCAA 100: Greene 9.1, Miller 9.2

PROVO, Utah — Short, swift Charlie Greene of Nebraska joined a swelling list of 9.1 sprinters in the 47th annual NCAA track and field championships Thursday night when he was clocked in the 100-yard dash world record time over the fast BYU track.

The performance came in the second heat of the first-round trials as he led Fred Kuller of USC to the tape by four tenths of a second. It took two tenths of a second off the NCAA meet record set in 1957 by Bobby Morrow.

The former Seattle (O'Dea High) prep star walked away from interviewers with a shrug and a "No comment" statement, but the feeling was he had been spurred on by the 9.2 clocking by Lennox Miller, USC sophomore, in the first heat.

Track Has 'Spring'

"I've run a 9.3 before," said Miller, "and think the difference between that race and tonight was the track. It seems to have lots of spring to it."

Greene, a 21-year-old Cornhusker senior, joins Bob Hayes, Harry Jerome, and Jimmy Hines in the 9.1 class. An allowable breeze of 3.0 m.p.h. was recorded at the time.

Gerry Lindgren of Washington State became the first successful title defender when he defeated Oscar Moore of Southern Illinois by 100 yards in the six-mile.

His time of 28 minutes, 44 seconds was almost a minute slower than the meet mark, reflecting the toll the 4,470-foot altitude will exact of all distance runners here.

Moore stayed with the little Cougar scooter for four miles, but Lindgren poured it on from there and quickly pulled away. Third place went to Tom Henonen of Minnesota, a half a lap back.

Six-Mile Run

The six-mile was the only championship decided on the opening evening of the three-night meet.

Qualifying and first-round trials did not develop any stirring upsets with USC's Trojans still the solid favorites to wrest the team championship from the defending Bruins of UCLA.

In all, two NCAA meet marks were broken and a third tied. Tommie Smith, San Jose State sprint flash, clipped three-tenths of a second off Henry Carr's 220-yard dash record with a clocking of 20.2 seconds. The tie was a 13.6 performance in the high hurdles.

Although he was only two-tenths of a second shy of his own world record, Smith felt a slow start prevented him from going faster.

"I came out high on the start. I'll be able to do better," said the fleet Spartan.

Miller posted two Trojan records in his sprint heats. His 9.2 for the 100 was a tenth faster than his previous best and that of Mel Patton, posted in 1948. In the furlong, his 20.5 also clipped a tenth off his own school mark.

Coach Vern Wolfe's favored team emerged from the first night with 12 qualifiers compared with 11 for UCLA and Oregon.

USC lost McCullouch in the long jump (22-5/8); Greg Heet in the high jump (6-6); Rich Joyce in the half (1:51.6), and Roger Wolff in the quarter (48.7).

Indications of a great high hurdle race in the making tonight came when Earl McCullouch of USC and Richmond Flowers of Tennessee were clocked in the NCAA meet record tying time of 13.6 seconds.
