RUNS 9.1 AT FRESNO

Carlos Disappointed, 'Only' Ties 100 Record

FRESNO—Far behind him are the angry moments when he thrust his black-gloved fist into the sky at Mexico City.

John Carlos wants to be loved today. If he had spent a few moments less wooing the turnaway crowd of 15,000 he might have given the West Coast Relays the magic 9 flat 100 yards they were hoping for.

John and the crowd had to settle for a world record-equaling 9.1 as he churned down Ratcliffe Stadium's clay track to win the 100 from Olympian Ronnie Ray Smith by four yards.

A spectator pulled a mean trick on the 25-year old San Jose State sophomore when he yelled "8.8" at John as he waited for the official time

"It really felt as though I ran 8.8 or 8.9," said John. "Frankly, I was disappointed in the time they announced."

When he heard the "8.8" rumor, John leaped into the air and sprinted the 100 yards in reverse probably clocking at least 9.1 in his reverse run. Then came the official 9.1 reading and John pleaded his case to the stands all 15,000 of them.

The three official watches read 9.0, 9.1 and 9.1, with the alternate watch also 9.1.

In the nearly two hours between the time he "jogged" 9.4 in a 100 heat to the time he ran the 9.1, Carlos never sat down. He made three trips up the steep 48 steps to the press box, where he informed reporters first how he was "going to
