

# BRUIN, TROJAN TRACK TEAMS ROMP

UCLA's James McAllister got it started with a foul jump of 27-10 in the long jump and USC's Edsel Garrison wound it up with a 44.7 anchor lap in the mile relay.

That's the kind of day it was, a beautiful day for track, incidentally, as the Bruins and Trojans stomped all over Stanford and California in a rousing doubleheader at Westwood Saturday.

A crowd of 12,343 saw UCLA thrash Stanford, 108-37, and USC humble California, 101-43, and if you're looking forward to the Bruin-Trojan showdown, May 8, here's what you get when you match the best marks of both teams Saturday:

USC 75½, UCLA 69½.

Hold all bets, however, because some explanations are in order. UCLA's Wayne Collett, for instance, ran only 52.9 for second in the 440 hurdles after easing up, and you could hardly rate him third behind USC's Henry Jackson and Bobby Coffman, who ran 52.3 and 52.5 respectively.

Other adjustments would have to be made, depending on wind, injuries and what have you, but make no mistake, the Trojans are looking mighty fierce.

## From Behind

Willie Deckard anchored Troy to a 39.5 in the 440 relay and won the 220 in a meet record 20.5; Joe Antunovich set a personal record of 193.9 in the discus; Doug Lane improved his season's best to 63-0 3/4 in the shot, and then there was Garrison.

The ex-Centennial flash, after winning the 440 in a meet record 46.9, took the baton 20 yards behind Cal's Rick Brown on the anchor of the mile relay.

"I was ready to give up," said Garrison, "but when I hit the turn I heard the crowd whoopin' and hollerin' so I decided to give it a go. I had no idea I ran that fast. I was just trying to win."

McAllister, after being denied a collegiate record on his foul jump which, incidentally, was aided by an over-the-allowable wind of 5 m.p.h., came back to win with a legal 26-0. This surpassed a wind-aided 25-4 3/4 by USC's Henry Hines against Cal.

"He really made a believer out of me," said Hines. "They should call these meets 'The James McAllister Show.' That cat is really something. As for myself, I've just got to be more aggressive off the board."

UCLA coach Jim Bush said, "I think James will be the first man to do 28 feet (Bob Beamon by-

passed 28 feet in setting his world record of 29-2½). Believe me, he's a real threat to win that gold medal at Munich."

Other Bruin heroes included Rick Fletcher with a lifetime best of 7-0 1/4 in the high jump, Denny Rogers with a school record of 51-9½ in the triple jump and Ruben Chappins with a personal record of 8:52.4 in the two-mile.

Bush, however, was happiest about the crowd.

"This proves that track and field will draw if you have the right attraction," he said. "If Cal had met USC at the Coliseum while we were meeting Stanford here, I don't think the combined crowds would have hit 6,000. This looks like the answer."

## Track Notes

In the 440 relay, California failed to make connections on the last pass between Dave Masters and Eddie Hart. They were trailing by two yards at the time. Hart and Isaac Curtis both aggravated injuries in the 100 and scratched from the 220. Hart has a cramp or a pull and Curtis a foot injury. . . USC's Lance Babb, winner of the high hurdles in 14.0, almost didn't run after injuring his right foot Saturday morning in an accident at home. He decided to give it a try after X-rays at UCLA Medical Center proved negative. "That was a real courageous performance," said coach Vern Wolfe. "At that time we needed the points, and Lance's come-through really sparked us."

Garrison, on the upcoming race against Collett and John

Smith of the Bruins: "I'll be going all out, that's for sure. I'm not going to give Wayne an inch and I'm sure he won't give me one. There'll be no coastin', no floatin'. They've got to run." . . Cal coach Dave Maggard gives a slight edge to UCLA in the meet with USC "because of a little better first-place strength" and rates UCLA, Oregon and USC the top three in the country over Texas (El Paso) . . . McAllister, who starts spring football practice this week, said it's still doubtful he will compete against the Trojans.
