

STEVE WILLIAMS RUNS 9.1 IN 100

FRESNO—Steve Williams, a 19-year-old speedster from New York City, equalled the world record of 9-1 seconds in the 100-yard dash Saturday night in the 46th annual West Coast Relays.

Williams outsped a field that included Don Quarrie, Herb Washington and Willie Deckard in the record-matching finale. He also ran a wind-aided 9.1 in a qualifying heat.

Williams was named the outstanding athlete of the meet for tying the record originally set by Bob Hayes in 1963 and matched by Harry Jerome, Jim Hines, Charlie

Greene and John Carlos, who also did it on this Ratcliffe Stadium track.

There were a number of outstanding performances during the evening in which temperatures hit 88 degrees.

—Al Feuerbach, saying he wasn't "very excited" this week after setting a world record of 71.7 a week ago, put the shot 69-11 1/4.

—A last try 26-3/4 long jump by USC's Randy Williams, to win before his home town fans.

—A lifetime pole vault best of 17-6 by Bob Richards, Jr., son of two-time Olympic gold medalist Bob Richards.

—Milan Tiff of UCLA triple jumped 54-1 1/4, best in the world this year.

Ex-Michigan State sprinter Washington, gave the first indication that good sprint times would be in order when he clocked a wind-aided 9.3 in his 100 heat.

Only Good Start

Then the skinny, 6-3 Williams settled in the blocks and got what he said was his only good start of the evening in cruising to a windy 9.1.

"The heat was easier than the final," said the sprinter who has transferred to Cal State from Paso and is competing this season for the San Diego TC.

In the final Williams said he got off to his more normal start. He figured he spotted the fast-starting Washington a step. Williams pulled even with Washington at 50 yards, then pulled away.

The wind was measured at 4.470 miles per hour. The allowable limit for a world record is 4.473.

USC's Quarrie closed fast to catch Washington and take second in 9.3.

After the race Williams said he was sick, mad and felt he could run faster.

No Serious Training

"I was mad because the Martin Luther King Games (in Philadelphia) invited me and then backed out," he said. "I wanted to go there and then go home. You might say I ran from spite. I wasn't scheduled to run here and I've got a bad cold. Actually I haven't been training that seriously since I'm red-shirting and I should do better later in the year. This race isn't really mine. My best is the 220."

Williams showed the effects of his cold in the mile relay, running only a 47.5 leg as his San Diego Track Club fell to UCLA, which clocked 3:08.2.

Bruin Benny Brown found himself in an unusually tough anchor battle with San Diego's James Redd, but the UCLA so-

phomore pulled away in the last 70-yards.
