Williams Wins Race...Loses Record

Steve Williams of San Diego State was unable to reclaim a share of the world 100-yard dash record Saturday in the Fresno Relays, clocking a wind-aided 9.3 only hours after Ivory Crockett ran track's first 9 flat at Knoxville

Williams, who last year equaled the world record of 9.1 at Fresno, indicated he was ready for another assault when he easily won his heat in a wind-

aided 9.2 In the final, however, he was hard-pressed to hold off Don Quarrie of the Beverly Hills Striders after taking the lead at the 40-yard mark. Quarrie also ran 9.3. The wind was 5.2 m.p.h. over the allowable of 4.473.

"I'm very happy for Ivory Crockett," said Williams. "I knew someone would set the 100 record before I did. I've been coming around very slowly this year. I haven't done any speed work. Most of my training has been quarter-mile type."

Williams said he may meet Crockett in the California Relays at Modesto. May 25.

"I have to have somebody to chase to run a fast time," he said. "It looks like Crockett will be the man. I'm not a time-conscious runner. I run to win. The track felt sandy today, slower than last year.

Charles Rich, former UCLA athlete, set a meet record of 13.3 in the high hurdles. The old mark of 13.5 was set in 1950 by Dick Attlesev of USC. Attlesev's mark was a world record at the time.

George Woods of the Pacific Coast Club won the shot at 69-5 and Mohinder Gill of Cal International won the triple jump on his final attempt, going 54-8 3/4 to beat teammate Milan Tiff, who had led at 54-4 3/4.

World record holder Al Feuerbach did not compete in the shot.

Vic Dias won the pole vault at 17-61/2, his best mark ever outdoors. UCLA's Ron Mooers tied for fourth with a lifetime best of 17-0.

Williams came back later to anchor San Diego State to a 1:23.5 victory in the 880 relay. He was clocked in 19.8 as he overhauled Vince Breddell of San Jose State.

Rich was named outstanding athlete of the meet. Junior college honors went to Karl Farmer. who anchored L.A. Southwest to victories in the 440, 880 and mile relays.
