

STEVE WILLIAMS IMPRESSIVE IN 100—WINDY 9.1

Steve Williams ran his first 100-yard dash of the year Saturday at the 17th annual Mt. San Antonio Relays. For openers, it wasn't bad.

Riding a strong following wind, the 21-year-old New Yorker sped to a clocking of 9.1, only one-tenth of a second off the world record. The wind was 8.49 m.p.h., well over the allowable of 4.47.

On a day when Dave Roberts failed to show in the pole vault and when USC and UCLA saved a number of their athletes for next week's dual meet, Williams saved the day for spectators.

There were other good marks, however. John Powell won the discus at 216-5. Chuck Steffes of the Bay Area Striders took the triple jump with a wind-aided 54-3¾ and UCLA's Benny Brown breezed to a 46.4 victory in the 440.

And UCLA coach Jim Bush may have finally found himself a sprinter in Dotson Wilson who won the open 100 in 9.5. The wind was legal for this one.

"I'm shocked," said Bush. "Dotson has been working out well, but I didn't know he was ready for this. I'll tell you this, we need him. We're having trouble finding four healthy bodies for the 440 relay team."

Roberts, world record holder in the pole vault at 18-6½, scratched from the meet after an attack of tonsillitis. He competed in the Drake Relays Friday but failed to clear a height.

In his absence, the event was won by UCLA's Ron Mooers who cleared a lifetime best of 17-8½. Don Baird of Long Beach State was second at the same height. Neither came close to 18-0½.

"I think I could have made it if I had gone to a heavier pole," said Mooers. "There's no question I'm going to make 18 feet, it's just a matter of when."

"Maybe next week," he smiled.

UCLA's Mike Tully, who has cleared 17-9 this year, was third at 17-0. Texas El-Paso's Larry Jessee, who twice has cleared 18 feet this year, was fourth, also at 17-0.

In the 100, Williams had an average start, then swiftly took command. He was pulling away at the finish where he had 2½ yards on Larry Brown of Arizona.

"Everything I do is pointing to Montreal," said Williams. "That's why

I kept running 10 yards after the finish. All my thinking is in terms of 100 meters.

"Physically, I don't think there is anybody in the world who can beat me. All I have to do is get myself together mentally. From now on, it's all business—no more easing up, no more cruising, no more looking around at the finish."

Williams was asked about John Carlos' prediction that Valeriy Borzov would be a repeat winner at Montreal.

Williams paused, smiled and said with a shrug, "That's Carlos—he didn't win it, either, did he?"

In the 440, Brown misjudged the

tape and eased up up 10 yards from the finish.

"He would have broken 46 seconds," said Bush.

Brown said he would run the 440, 220 and both relays next week against USC.

"I won't be all out in the 440," he said, "because I know we'll be behind in the mile relay and I'll need my best race there."

How much of a lead on Brown will the Trojans need to win the mile relay?

USC's Tom Andrews, asked the question, said, "About five or six yards."

Brown said, "That's not going to do it."

Then how much?

"They've got to have 20 yards or more," said Brown.

And how fast can Benny run?

"Whatever it takes," he said.

USC's Russ Rogers won the open pole vault at 16-11¼. He had one reasonable effort at 17-8. "I think I can get it next week," he said. "I know UCLA has great vaulters, but we're going to give them a battle." USC's Tom DiStanislaw, second at 16-6, almost cleared 16-11¼ but hit it on the way down. "He was out three weeks with mononucleosis," said coach Vern Wolfe, "or he already would have been over 17. He's going to be a good one." ...

Arnie Robinson won the long jump on his last try, going 26-3¾ to beat out USC's

Randy Williams, second at 26-1¾. Both marks were wind-aided ... Steve Wil-

liams said he will run a 220 next week in the San Jose Invitational. The following

week he will run in the Tom Black Classic at Knoxville, scene of Ivory Crockett's 9.0 in the 100 last year ... Fortune Gordien won the Masters discus a day after son Marcus won the jaycee discus at 184-7½ ... The meet concludes today with women's events and the final five events of the decathlon, starting at 8:30 a.m.
