

McTear Runs 10.2 100 Meters

KNOXVILLE (AP)—After setting a national high school record in the preliminaries, Houston McTear ran 10.2 in winning the 100-meter dash Saturday in the national AAU junior track and field championships.

McTear, an 18-year-old high school junior from Milligan, Fla., bolted to a mark of 10.0 in the qualifying trials Friday night. The world record of 9.9 is shared by six sprinters.

The top two finishers in each event here will represent the United States against a junior team from the Soviet Union in a meet at Lincoln, Neb., July 4-5.

Greg Robertson of USC and Scott Genter of Tennessee broke the meet discus record of 174 feet 11 inches set by Marshall Smith of Colorado State in 1972. Robertson finished first Saturday with a throw of 183-3. Genter was second at 181-4.

Michigan State's Howard Neely broke the meet record for the 400-meter intermediate hurdles with a time of 51.2, four-tenths of a second faster than the mark set last year by Greg Ackman of the Pennsylvania Athletic Club.

Another meet record was established by Villanova freshman Mark Belger with a 1:47.5 in the 800 meters. The old record of 1:48.5 was set by Dale Scott, Washington State, in 1973.
