Stones Jumps 7-41/4 to Set a Record

World record holder Dwight Stones, competing in his first outdoor meet for Long Beach State, set a school record of 7-41/4 in the high jump Saturday at UC Irvine in a four-way meet which also included USC, San Diego State and UCI. Stones, holder of the world outdoor and indoor records

at 7-61/2, tried three times at 7-7 but didn't come close. USC, defending Pacific 8 champion, won 9 of 18 events

in the non-scoring meet. Top performances included 20.7 by freshman Joel Andrews in the 200 meters, 13.9 by Fred Shaw in the high hurdles, 51.0 by Rich Graybehl in the intermediate hurdles, 184-4 by Ralph Fruguglietti in the discus and 17-0 by Russ Rogers in the pole vault. USC lost both relays because of mishaps on the final

legs while holding big leads. In the 400-meter relay, Ken Randle failed to complete the final pass to James Gilkes. In the 1,600-meter relay, anchorman Trevor Campbell pulled up with a cramp.
