## USC, UCLA Track Teams Win in Preview of Nothing

double dual meet at Drake Stadium Saturday was supposed to be a preview of the USC-UCLA meet May 1. It wasn't. Cold weather, cautious coaches and

tired, uninspired athletes combined to make it a rather dreary affair that proved little to 6,565 shivering fans. For the record, UCLA beat Califor-

ria, 79-65, for its 40th straight dual meet victory, and USC routed Stan-ford, 105-35, for its fifth straight this erason

Comparing UCLA and USC marks. the Trojans come out on top, 741/2-691/2, but it doesn't mean a thing.

USC's James Gilkes didn't run eith-er sprint, for instance. Neither USC's er sprint, for instance. Neither USC's Ken Randle nor UCLA's Bennie Myles ran the 400 meters. UCLA's Grant Niederhaus passed up the in-termediate hurdles and USC's Rayfield Beaton ran the 1,500 instead of the 800.

The advertised duel between UCLA's Jeff Haynes and Cal's James Robinson in the 800 didn't come off. Robinson opted for the 400, hoping to meet Myles. He didn't know that Myles already had opted for the 200.

That's the kind of day it was.

The only meet record was pro-duced by UCLA's James Owens, win-ner of the high hurdles in 13.6. That equals his lifetime best. Best of the Trojan marks was a 192-2 in the dis-Trojan marks was a 192-2 in the dis-cus by Ralph Fruguglietti. Team-mate Darrell Elder was second at 189-8, giving both Trojans a better mark than UCLA's Rich Gunther, winner against Cal at 188-4.
