## Quarrie, Owens Win at Fresno UCLA Hurdler Beats

Good Field in 13.7

FRESNO—Jamaica's Don Quarrie made his first 100 start of the year a successful one and UCLA's James Owens bolted back into the Olympic high hurdles picture with impressive victories Saturday in the 49th West Coast Relays on a warm, virtually windless night at Ratcliffe Stadium.

Quarrie, formerly of USC and the National AAU champion in both sprints, took command of the 100 meters at the halfway mark and freewheeled home for a 10.24 victory.

Owens, rebounding from thirdplace finishes in the Mt. San Antonio Relays and the USC dual meet, went wire-to-wire in the 110-meter highs, throwing his arms aloft in triumph as he crossed the line in 13.77. He beat a powerful field, including secondplace Dedy Cooper of San Jose State, the Mt. Sac winner, and fourth-place Tom Hill of the U.S. Army, the Olympic bronze medalist at Munich.

Other top marks included 1:47.22 by Kenya's Mike Boit in the 800 meters, 26-414 by Olympic champion Randy Williams in the long jump, 68-1034 by George Woods in the shot and 45.58 by Maxie Parks of the Maccabi Track Club in the 400 meters. Dan Briagu of the Pacific Coast
