

Quarrie, Owens Win at Fresno

UCLA Hurdler Beats Good Field in 13.7

FRESNO—Jamaica's Don Quarrie made his first 100 start of the year a successful one and UCLA's James Owens bolted back into the Olympic high hurdles picture with impressive victories Saturday in the 49th West Coast Relays on a warm, virtually windless night at Ratcliffe Stadium.

Quarrie, formerly of USC and the National AAU champion in both sprints, took command of the 100 meters at the halfway mark and free-wheeled home for a 10.24 victory.

Owens, rebounding from third-place finishes in the Mt. San Antonio Relays and the USC dual meet, went wire-to-wire in the 110-meter highs, throwing his arms aloft in triumph as he crossed the line in 13.77. He beat a powerful field, including second-place Dedy Cooper of San Jose State, the Mt. Sac winner, and fourth-place Tom Hill of the U.S. Army, the Olympic bronze medalist at Munich.

Other top marks included 1:47.22 by Kenya's Mike Boit in the 800 meters, 26-4¼ by Olympic champion Randy Williams in the long jump, 68-10¾ by George Woods in the shot and 45.58 by Maxie Parks of the Maccabi Track Club in the 400 meters.

State both cleared 18 feet in the pole vault. Ripley winning on fewer misses. In fact, it took Ripley only two jumps to win the competition. He didn't start vaulting until the bar reached 17 feet. He cleared that, then passed 17-6 to take his next try at 18 feet. He cleared that on his first try, going over by three or four inches, then both tried for a world record of 18-7.

Neither came close, Ripley going out of control on the top of his vaults and Baird not quite getting up there, although Baird's final try was a good effort.

USC broke the school record in the mile relay with a time of 3:06.13—but finished second. The old mark was 3:06.3. USC's Kenny Randle ran a 45.3 anchor leg but couldn't quite catch Parks of the Maccabi team. Parks lost most of his five-yard lead but Maccabi won in 3:06.12—with USC just one-hundredths of a second back.

USC won the other section of the mile relay with its No. 2 team in 3:09.79. Rayfield Beaton anchored in 46.2. If anybody ever comes up with an eight-man two-mile relay, put your money on the Trojans.

Quarrie's time, although well off the world record of 9.9, was a good clocking under the circumstances. The races were timed electrically, which produces clockings two to three-tenths slower than hand clockings, and the usual friendly winds of Fresno never made their appearance.

Emphasizing the difference in conditions was the performance of San Jose State's Ron Whitaker in the 100. Last week, with hand timing and a legal but aiding wind at San Jose, he ran 10 flat. Saturday night, he failed to qualify, running 10.49 in his heat.

Quarrie said, "It felt pretty good. I wasn't trying to run a perfect race. I was just trying to enjoy it. I don't want to concentrate too hard at this stage."

Owens said, "I really wanted this one. Believe me, it's a great feeling. I was really down after the USC meet, but I just decided to work harder and concentrate on the last five hurdles. That's where I've been folding up. Tonight, I pushed it all the way."

In junior college competition, national javelin records were set by John Rudd of Pasadena, 50.56 in the 40 hurdles, and Mike Marlow of Consumnes River, 52-9 in the triple jump.

Rudd broke the record of 50.8 set last year by Grant Niederhaus, also of Pasadena. Marlow broke the mark of 52-4 1/2 set by Clarence Taylor of Forest Park (Mo.) in 1973.
