

USC SETS WORLD RECORD IN LOSS

The Tobias Striders, with a team of four USC alumni, edged USC Saturday night in the 800-meter relay with a time of 1:20.2, fastest in history, in the Sun Devil Relay meet at Tempe, Ariz.

USC was clocked in 1:20.3 and will apply for a world record. Tobias is not eligible because it ran a multi-national team. The record is 1:21.4 set last year by Arizona State.

The Tobias team of Guy Abrahams, Mike Simmons, Don Quarrie and James Gilkes ran even with a USC team of Joel Andrews, James Sanford, Billy Mullins and Clancy Edwards

until Gilkes edged Edwards at the wire. Gilkes was timed in 19.3, Edwards in 19.4 on their 200-meter legs.

Abrahams is native of Panama, Quarrie of Jamaica and Gilkes of Guyana. Quarrie, as an undergraduate at USC in 1972, ran on a Trojan team which set all-time best of 1:20.7 in the 880-yard relay.

USC won the mile relay in 3:03.3, fastest time of the year and only a half-second off Arizona State's collegiate record of 3:02.8. Mullins ran the third leg in a blistering 44.4.
