NCAA Champion Puts Shot 66-51/2 and Shows a Big Improvement in the Discus; Bruins and USC Win Easily

BERKELEY-UCLA's Dave Laut only dabbles in the discus. The shotput is the NCAA champion's specialty.

But Laut was impressive in both events Saturday at Edwards Stadium, where UCLA defeated California, 86-68, and USC routed Stanford, 105-43, in a double dual Pacific 10 track meet.

Laut had a lifetime best of 66-51/2 in the shotput and hurled the discus 174-6-14 feet farther than his previous best. His shot series was a consistent 65-41/4, 65-6, 63-91/2, 66-51/2, 64-01/2 and foul

I honestly believe I can go to 70 feet this year," the 6-4, 260-pound Bruin said. If so, he'd be in world class company, Udo Beyer of East Germany is the pending

world recordholder at 72-8. Laut seems to get better each week in the shotput and he is getting competition

from his own teammate, Marcus Gordien, who became eligible last week Gordien, son of former world discus rec-

ord-holder Fortune Gordien, had a lifetime best of 63-6 34 in the shotput

He won his specialty, the discus, with a throw of 187-10.

"Marcus has really been pushing me in the shot," Laut said. "And he's worked so hard in the shot that he has been a little tight in the discus. But he'll cut loose soon.

"I've been doing more weight than technique work in the shot but that will change as the season progresses. As for my discus throw today, I was really surprised. I only threw the discus once last week in practice. But it was such a nice day and I felt good.

It was, indeed, a perfect afternoon for track and field-clear skies, 70-degree temperature and a mild breeze

This meet, attended by 8,000, was suposed to serve as a comparison between UCLA and USC prior to their showdown April 28 at Drake Stadium

But neither team, with a few exceptions, performed to its capabilities. Some of the highlights:

-USC's Ilpo Paananen got off a lifetime best throw of 240-0 in the javelin and is now favored over UCLA's strong corps of

-Trojan Jerry Mulligan won the pole vault at 17-0-his best effort of the yearand could score in that event against UCLA, which has three top vaulters. -UCLA's Greg Foster said his legs felt

tight but he still looked fluid in winning the 110-meter high hurdles in an eased-up 13.62. He didn't compete in the sprint relay,

100 or 200. -USC's Billy Mullins, the NCAA 400meter champion, was slowing up at the fin-

ish while winning the quarter-mile in a creditable 46.48.

Now for the lowlights: -A six-man field was reduced to three in the USC-Stanford 100 meters when the Cardinals' Gordon Banks and the Trojans' Kevin Williams and James Stanford, were disqualified for false starts in that order. USC's Colin Bradford, a quarter-miler, won and teammate Arto Bryggare, a hurdler, was runnerup. But Bryggare didn't get second because he was nonscoring compe-

-Joe Parker, UCLA's freshman quarter-miler, pulled up lame at the 200 mark of the 400 and USC freshman hurdler Phi Johnson took a bad spill at the second barrier in the 110-meter race. UCLA's quarter-mile contingent has already been weakened by the loss of Donn Thompson.
