USC SPRINTERS RUN TWO 'BESTS

USC's James Sanford ran 100 meters in 10.03, which equals the fourth best time ever and is the fastest in the world in two years, and also won the 200 in 19.7 (handtimed) at the El Paso Invitational track meet Saturday at

El Paso, Tex USC's Billy Mullins also ran the fastest 400 in the world this year, 45.03, to win, and the Trojans' Bill Green was second in 45.39. Bert Cameron of the University of Texas El Paso, expected to give Mullins a battle, was third in

The Trojan 400-meter relay team of Phillip Johnson, Mullins, Sanford and Green won with a time of 38.85 in the nonscoring meet

USC's Larry Doubley won the long jump, but fell short of his prediction of 27-0. He jumped 26-3. The Trojans' Ken Hays was second at 25-11 and had five jumps over 25-5. In the 100, NCAA champion Jerome Deal of UTEP was

second with a time of 10.28. In the 200, Darryl Martin, unattached, was second at 21.1 USC's Tony Campbell, despite having the flu and a 102-

degree temperature, won the 110 high hurdles in 13.67, with Johnson second at 14.47. Former UTEP pole vaulter Larry Jessee, competing un-

attached, won with a vault of 18-4 and was named the meet's outstanding field-event performer. Sanford was named outstanding runner.

Other winners with outstanding marks were UTEP's Peter Lemashon, 1:48.09 in the 800, USC's Hays, 53-2½ (four jumps over 52-6) in the triple jump, Wilson Waigwa, 4:00.6 in the mile, James Munyala, 8:34.85 in the steeplechase, and Holland's Harry Schultzing, 49.9 in the 400 intermediate hurdles

Leon Smith, unattached, won the high jump at 7-0, while USC's Dennis Smith, competing with a cast up to his elbow due to a broken wrist he suffered Monday during spring football practice, was second with a jump of 6-10.
