Former Auburn sprinter Harvey Glance celebrated his 24th birthday by running the fastest 100 meters in history Saturday night in the Floriday Relays at Gainseville, Fla., but officials said he would be denied a world record because the photo-timing camera broke down.

Four stopwatches caught Glance in an average of 9.74 seconds and officials rounded off the time to 9.8.

The hand-timed record for the 100 is 9.9, held by several sprinters. Hand-timed marks are no longer acceptable, however. The electronically timed record is 9.95 by Jim Hines in 1968.

Across the country at Stanford University there was another electronic malfunction, depriving USC's Bill Green of the fastest 400-meter clocking in the world this year.

Green's time originally was announced as 45.17, but officials said the electronic timer did not start properly and Green was awarded a hand-clocked time of 45.4.

Sprinter James Sanford, who is sitting out the year at USC, won the 100 meters in 10.10, aided by a wind just over the allowable of two meters per second.

All-American running back Herschel Walker of Georgia won the football 100 in 10.4, followed by Stanford's Darrin Nelson, who was timed in 10.5, and USC's Kevin Nelson, who was timed in 10.5, and USC's Kevin Williams at 10.6. San Jose State's Gerald Willhite and Nebraska's Jarvis Redwine also finished ahead of Hines, who was sixth in 10.9.

At Dallas three-time NCAA champion Michael Carter, making his first outdoor appearance of the season, threw the shot 67-6 in the Dallas Invitational track and field meet.
