## UCLA Women Upset by Lady Vols Tennesee's Victory in 1.600 Relay Clinches AIAW Title

Despite a few puddles, Tennessee's Lady Volunteers sloshed to the AIAW track and field championships Sat-

urday in Austin.

The Lady Vols set a collegiate record in the 1,600-

meter relay to edge out UCLA by four points, 61-57, in the final team standings.

Tennessee won the race in 3.31.70, which broke the record of 3.32.8 set by Prairie View in 1979. UCLA was

clocked in 3:32.08.

UCLA, which was seeking its third AIAW title, nearly won despite failing to win a single event.

In Villanova, Pa., Steve Scott used a strong closing kick to pass Sydney Maree in the last 30 yards to win the inaugural Jumbo Elliott Invitational Track Meet. Scott's time was 3:52.26; Maree ran a personal best

3-52.44. James Robinson won the 800 in 1-44.63, the fastest time in the world this year.

Pam Spencer, competing for the Los Angeles Naturite Track Club, high-jumped 6-5¼ to set a national record for women in the Track and Field Assn-USA championships in Wichita, Kan. Cal Poly San Luis Obispo won an unprecedented sixth NCAA Division II championship and its third straight in the meet at Macchampionship and its third straight in the meet at Mac-

omb, Ill. Twins Charles and Frank Assumma of UC-Riverside set Division II records, Charles winning the 5,000 meters in 13,59,10 and Frank the 1,500 in 3,40,96.
