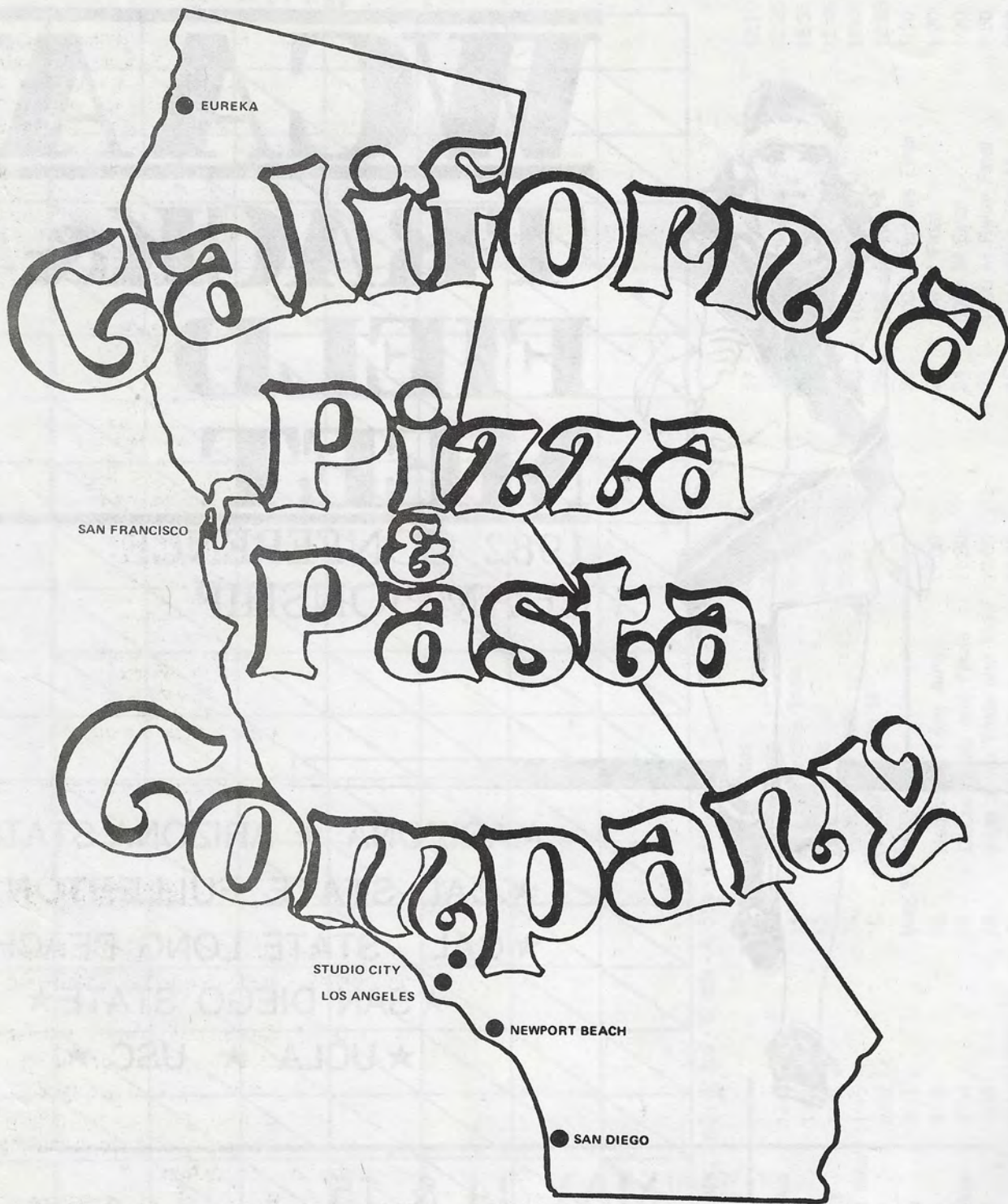

WCAA Strongest in Nation

Top Athletes, Teams in Conference

The Western Collegiate Athletic Association was organized on September 26, 1976 to provide conference competition for five universities with nationally recognized intercollegiate women's athletic programs.

University of Southern California, Cal State Long Beach, UCLA, Cal State Fullerton, and San Diego State are the charter members of the WCAA and competed in seven conference sports—volleyball, basketball, tennis, golf, track and field, swimming and diving, and gymnastics.

In 1979 two new conference sports were added—cross country and softball—and the original five school membership was enlarged to include Arizona State and the University of Arizona making the WCAA one of the most competitive conferences ever established for women.

The WCAA's record of athletic achievement is unparalleled. The list of accomplishments includes both national collegiate and team titles, Broderick Award recipients, as well as a host of Olympians from the United States and abroad.

Previously aligned with the AIAW, the WCAA voted as a conference to join the Division I of the NCAA beginning with the 1981-82 season.

In its brief six year history, the WCAA has proven to be the premier women's athletic conference in the nation.

The competition will grow even stronger in the 1982-83 season when Stanford University joins the WCAA.

1981 WCAA Recap

UCLA Sweeps—16 Records Fall

WCAA meet records were set in 16 of the 20 events at the 1981 conference track championships hosted by San Diego State at Choc Sportsman Track. Four records were broken on the first day as Arizona State took a three point lead in team standings over UCLA, 40 to 37.

UCLA had three first place finishers on the opening day including meet records in the 800 meter relay and the javelin throw by Bruin Susie Ray. Arizona State took their early lead with a first, three seconds, and a third. Sun Devil distance runner Maria Trujillo set a meet record in the 10,000 meter run.

Arizona's Meg Ritchie, the current American record holder in the discus, set a meet record in that event, scoring 10 of the Wildcats' 25 points for third place. Host San Diego State was a close fourth with 24 points. Rounding out the field after the first day were USC, 19, Cal State Long Beach, 7, and Cal State Fullerton with 2.

The records continued to fall on the second day of competition. UCLA, paced by six first place finishes, captured their fifth consecutive conference track championship.

The Bruins scored most of their second day points in the sprints and relays. UCLA set meet records in both the 400 meter and 1600 meter relays. They also had two finishers in the top three of the

100 meter, 200 meter, and 400 meter dashes. Bruin heptathlete Tanya Alston set an AIAW record with 5595 points.

Arizona also had a strong showing on the second day, finishing with 137 points. Meg Ritchie set another meet record in the shot put. The Wildcats also captured meet records in the 5000 meter run by Marjorie Kaput, in the 400 meter hurdles by Robin Marks, and in the 3000 meter run by Joan Hansen.

Arizona State fell to third, finishing with 119 points. The Sun Devils' had a few bright spots in Trujillo's second place finish in the 5000 meter run and Brenda Calhoun winning the 100 meter hurdles.

Monica Joyce led San Diego State, setting records in the 800 meter and 1500 meter events. The Aztecs finished fourth in the conference with 103 points. Patti Stafford also set a meet record in the high jump.

USC finished fifth overall with 51 points. Kim Robinson, who finished second in the 200 meter dash and third in the 100 meter dash, led the Trojans. Kerry Zwart-Bell finished third in the heptathlon.

Cal State Long Beach finished sixth with 27 points and Cal State Fullerton rounded out the seven team field with three points.

1982 Meet Outlook

UA, SDSU tops—UCLA at half strength

UCLA, ranked second in the nation, may miss out on capturing its sixth consecutive WCAA Track and Field Championship, but only because the Bruins are sending a portion of their team to the meet. Without UCLA's full team at the meet, Arizona and San Diego State should battle for the championship.

San Diego State, who finished fourth in last year's conference meet, appears to have improved themselves with newcomers Lori Smith and Linda Bourn in the sprints and hurdles. The Aztecs have also added freshman Eva Ernstrom to their already strong contingent of middle and long distance runners.

The University of Arizona boasts three national champions, who are heavy favorites in their events at the conference meet; however, the Wildcats may be hurt by the loss of some of the distance runners who led them to a second place finish in 1981. Strong performances by freshman Ruth Waithera-Nganga in the sprints and senior Jan Oehm in the distance events could give Arizona the championship.

Even though they are bringing only portions of their team, UCLA may still finish third. The Bruins will be strong in the sprints, but it remains to be seen whether UCLA will have the same people on their relay teams, which had the best times in the conference for 1982.

Arizona State lost several key performers from last year's third place team, but the Sun Devils may be able to do well with strong performances from freshman sprinter Sharon Ware and distance runner Maria Trujillo. The Sun Devils should also pick up some points in the long jump and discus.

The battle for fifth place should come down to USC and Cal State Long Beach. USC has three competitors who are among the fa-

vorites to win their events. The Trojans should also pick up some points in the field events. The 49ers should see most of their points in the field events, but they may also score in the hurdles and sprints.

In only its second year as a collegiate program, Cal State Fullerton is looking toward the future, but the Titans may improve on last year's point total.

Sprints

A pair of freshmen are the favorites in the 100 meter dash. Arizona State's Sharon Ware, last year's top prep sprinter, has the best 100 time in the conference for 1982. Former prep All-America LaShon Nedd, now at UCLA, has the conference's fifth best time in the 100 meters. Arizona State sophomore Teri Chapple has a good chance to take both the 100 and 200. Chapple has the conference's fourth fastest time in the 100 and fifth fastest time in the 200.

The 200 meter dash will also feature four defending conference champions. Junior All-America Florence Griffith is the defending conference champion in the 200 and finished second at nationals in that event. She also holds the best time in the conference and second best time in the world in the 200 for 1982.

Griffith will also run in the 400 meter dash, an event in which she holds the conference's third best time. UCLA junior All-America Jeanette Bolden, defending conference champion in the 100, finished third in the 200 at last year's WCAA meet.

Two other UCLA juniors in the 200 are Arlise Emerson and Jackie Joyner. Emerson is the defending conference champion in the 400, while Joyner is the defending conference champion in the long jump. Joyner has the conference's sixth fastest time in the 200.

Other top sprinters in the conference are San Diego State junior Lori Smith, who broke Aztec records in both the 100 and 200;

University of Arizona sophomore Felicia DuPuch; and 1978 World Cup Finalist Ruth Waithera-Nganga.

Middle Distances

San Diego State junior Monica Joyce, last year's top middle distance runner in the WCAA, returns in 1982 to defend her 800 and 1500 conference titles. Joyce, who finished second at nationals in the 1500 in 1981, has the conference's top 1500 time and the second best 800 time in 1982.

USC freshman Donna Curtis will have the advantage of running on her own track. Curtis, who has the third fastest WCAA 800 time in 1982, holds the USC record for that distance.

UCLA senior Cynthia Warner and San Diego State senior Susan Hemond could finish high in the 800. Warner, a two-time All-America, was the conference champion in the 800 in 1980. Hemond, a San Diego State co-captain, was third in last year's WCAA 800.

Two other San Diego State runners could challenge in the 1500. Senior Lynn Kanuka has the conference's second best time in 1982, while freshman Eva Ernstrom holds the conference's seventh best mark.

Distances

Junior Monica Joyce has the best WCAA time in the 3,000 and the third best 5,000 time. She set a Cromwell Field record in the 5,000 earlier this season. Senior Lynn Kanuka should challenge her Aztec teammate. Kanuka, the conference 5,000 champion in 1980, has the second best conference time in both the 3,000 and 5,000 for 1982.

Posing the potential for a San Diego State sweep of the 3,000 and 5,000 is freshman Eva Ernstrom. Ernstrom, who set a Cromwell Field record in the 3,000 at the USC Invitational in March,

holds the conference's fastest 5,000 time and the third fastest 3,000 time.

A pair of Arizona runners could break up the San Diego State sweep. Senior Joy Hansen has the conference's fifth best 3,000 and 5,000 mark. Another senior Jan Oehm could challenge in the 3,000 and 5,000, but her best event is the 10,000 where she holds the conference's second best time.

To take the 10,000, Oehm will have to beat the defending conference champion and yet another pair of San Diego State runners. Arizona State junior Maria Trujillo set a meet record in taking the 10,000 last year. She also finished second in the 5,000 and fifth in the 3,000 at the 1981 conference meet.

San Diego State senior Liz Baker finished second in the 10,000 in 1981 and junior teammate Debra Chaddock holds the Cromwell Field record for the 10,000. Baker has the conference's third fastest 10,000 time while Chaddock has the conference's fourth fastest mark.

Hurdles

University of Arizona sophomore All-America Robin Marks could sweep the hurdle events at this year's conference meet. Marks, who finished second in the 100 hurdles at last year's WCAA meet, is the defending national and conference champion in the 400 meter hurdles.

To win the conference 100 meter hurdles, Marks will have to get past a pair of San Diego State hurdlers, junior Lori Smith and senior Linda Bourn. Smith, who finished first in the 100 hurdles at the USC Invitational in March, has the conference's fastest 100 hurdle time this season. Bourn, a transfer from BYU, has the conference's second fastest 100 hurdle time in 1982.

Field Events

Highlighting the field events will be University of Arizona All-America Meg Ritchie. Ritchie, two-time defending conference champion in

both the shot put and discus, is the defending national champion in the shot put and the 1980 national champion in the discus. She holds the American record in both the shot put and discus.

A trio of Cal State Long Beach shot putters will be challenging Ritchie. Junior All-america Ramona Pagel was third in last year's conference meet and fifth at nationals. Senior Annie McElroy, who finished sixth at last year's meet, has the third longest throw in the WCAA this season. Junior Peggy-Pollack has the conference's fourth best throw this season.

Arizona State sophomore Leslie Deniz, who finished third last year in the WCAA discus, has the second longest throw in the conference in 1982.

The heavy favorite in the high jump is University of Arizona freshman Charmaine Gale. Gale, the AIAW indoor high jump champion, has a personal best of 6'5". San Diego State senior Patti Staf-

ford will be returning to defend her conference title.

USC senior Sandy Crabtree should take her second WCAA long jump title. Crabtree, who has the longest jump of any other longjumper in the meet, was the 1980 WCAA long jump champion. Should Crabtree falter, Arizona State's Anna Van or Long Beach's Chandra Roberts could come away with the long jump title.

Two-time All-America Jacque Nelson of UCLA is the favorite in the javelin throw. A junior, Nelson is a former national champion and holds the Cromwell Field record for the javelin throw.

Heptathlon

The heptathlon will be a battle between two WCAA rivals--USC junior Kerry Zwart-Bell and San Diego State junior Carrie McLaughlin. McLaughlin finished second in the WCAA meet and fifth at nationals last year. Bell finished third in the WCAA meet and seventh at nationals in 1981.

Meet Director Sherry Calvert



Sherry Calvert will be adding another credit to her longterm involvement in women's track and field as Tournament Director of the 6th Western Collegiate Athletic Association Track and Field Championships.

Formerly the WCAA Track and Field Coordinator, Sherry's involvement in amateur athletics has spanned the gamut from collegiate competition to the Olympics.

Sherry's unique background allows her to direct a conference championship with the experience of a world-class athlete and a collegiate coach.

As a coach Sherry started USC's track and field program in 1973 and has continued in that position for eight years. Her tenure is the longest among Trojan women's athletic coaches.

As an athlete Sherry attended USC, participating in the 1972 and 1976 Olympic Games. A four-year All-America in the javelin, Sherry was named Outstanding College Athlete of America in 1973. Capturing seven Gold Medals at the Central American Games in 1967-69, Sherry was the National AAU Javelin Champion in 1967, 1970-72, and 1978.

In 1971 Sherry took the Silver Medal in the Pan American

Games and returned in 1975 to win the Gold Medal. One of three American women to throw the javelin over 200 feet, Sherry's mark of 207-11 is the third best in the nation.

Not limited to her work at USC, Sherry is a member of the Southern California Olympians Board of Directors and will work closely with the development of the 1984 Olympic track at the Los Angeles Coliseum.

Once an athletic representative to The Athletic Congress, Sherry is a member of the AAU and the National Association of Girl's and Women's Sports.

Sherry's achievements in athletics was recognized in 1980 when she was named one of the Ten Outstanding Young Women in America

3 in Top 10 in 1981

WCAA Schools Strong In Track

USC

Hosting the WCAA track and field championships for the first time, the Trojans should turn in some of their best performances with the home field advantage.

Under head coach Sherry Calvert, in her eighth year, several athletes have a shot at capturing the conference title.

Trojans to watch will be heptathlete Kerry Zwart-Bell, long jumper Sandy Crabtree, sprinter Sabrina Williams, and middle distance runner Donna Curtis.

Zwart-Bell is presently second in the WCAA with 5443 points, set at the USC Invitational on March 28. Sandy Crabtree, the 1980 WCAA long jump champion, is the conference leader with a jump of 19-11 3/4. Donna Curtis is presently two seconds off the fastest time in the 800 meter run (2:08.2) and should challenge for the top spot. All three have already qualified for the NCAA championships.

UCLA

For the past five years the WCAA has been holding championships in track and field and for the past five years the University of California, Los Angeles has captured first place at those championships.

The Bruins have finished in the top five nationally four of the last five years, with national championships in 1975 and 1977. Scott Chisam has been head coach for four years, finishing 45th in his first year at UCLA and finishing 2nd in 1981.

UCLA returns with All-America juniors Jeannette Bolden, Florence Griffith, Arlise Emerson, and Linda Goen. Bolden is the defending conference champion in the 100 meters and a 1980 Olympian.

Griffith holds the 1981 WCAA record in the 200 meter and placed 2nd at the nationals. Emerson is the defending conference champion in the 400 meters and Goen was the 1500 meter champion in 1980. Though losing to SDSU's Monica Joyce in 1981, Goen went on to capture 4th in the nationals.

One newcomer for the Bruins, prep All-America freshman La Shon Nedd, holds the best time in the conference in the 400 meters.

"We had a good team last year and should have won nationals, but this year I feel we're even better," says Chisam.

Arizona

Under third-year coach Chris Murray, the University of Arizona returns to the championships after placing second in last years meet with a total of 137 points.

This year the Wildcats return with All-Americas junior Meg Ritchie and sophomore Robin Marks. Ritchie is the defending national collegiate shot put champion and won the national discus title in 1980. She was a finalist in the discus in the 1980 Moscow Olympics (representing her native Scotland).

Marks is both the defending conference and national champion in the 400 meter hurdles. Freshman Charmaine Gale is currently the 1982 National AIAW Indoor Champion in the high jump at 6-2.

"We're very strong in the throwing events and Robin is a favorite in the hurdles," Murry said. "I think we'll do well at the conference championships and I feel we'll finish in the top five in the nationals."

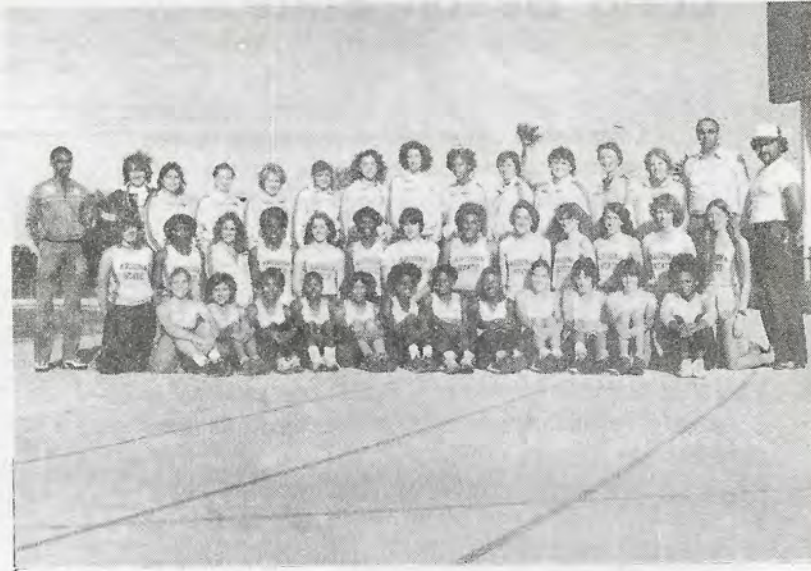
Arizona State

Arizona State returns to the championships after placing third in last year's competition with a score of 119. Under head coach Roger Kerr, currently in his fifth year, the Sun Devils have never ended a season lower than eighth nationally.

With a 1981-82 5-1 dual meet record, the team is led by junior Sabrina Peters and senior Maria Trujillo. Peters, a transfer from Monterey Peninsula College, has personal best times of 4:27.0 in the 1500 meters and 9:32.02 in the 3000 meters. Trujillo is also a transfer, from Hartnell College and is the 10,000 meters defending conference champion.

Discus thrower sophomore Leslie Deniz has the second best American collegiate distance, throwing 194-11. Sun Devil freshman Dodie Campbell comes to ASU with the best high school discus throw in the nation at 166-0.

"Overall we have filled most of the gaps that plagued us last year," Kerr said. "We don't have a weak event and should challenge for the conference title."

San Diego State

San Diego State comes to the WCAA with a 5-0 dual meet record and ranked among the top 20 in the nation.

Since taking over four years ago, head coach Fred LaPlante has led the Aztecs to an undefeated dual meet record, 18-0, registered the highest SDSU national track finish ever, 16th, and had his team ranked among the top dual meet teams for the past four years.

Top competitors for the Aztecs are junior Monica Joyce and senior Lynn Kanuka. Joyce established herself as a top middle distance runner after winning the 1981 conference 800 meters and 1500 meters in record times.

Kanuka, who was injured most of the 1981 season, was a double winner as a sophomore in the WCAA and placed 5th in the 5000 meters at the 1980 nationals.

SDSU also brings senior Patty Stafford, who is the defending WCAA champion in the high jump.

"I would like to see us place among the top three in the WCAA again and be rated among the top 10 in dual meet rankings," LaPlante said. "I'd even like to see the team improve to a top fifteen finish at the nationals this year."

Long Beach State

Long Beach, under second year coach Ronald Buss, returns to the championships as the only school in the conference to have three women throw the shot put over 50 feet.

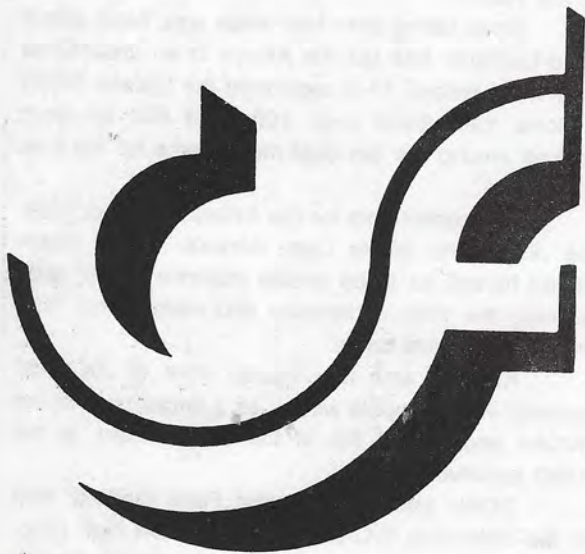
The 49ers are led by All-Americans junior Romona Pagel, senior Annie McElroy, and junior Peggy Pollack. In 1981, Pagel broke the school record in the discus with a throw of 160-5. Pollack threw 50-8 in 1980. McElroy, who has a lifetime best of 51-11, is a former school record holder in the discus, throwing 150-0.

49er junior Laura Kóterba recently set a school record in the 3000 meters with a time of 9:50.0.

"This is a young and talented team," says Bush. "I think we have really strong competitors in the shot put. Even though it's going to be a tougher field than last year, I think the strong finishers will be the ones that have been consistant all year."

Cal State Fullerton

Not only is Cal State Fullerton's track team one-year-old and the newest addition to the WCAA track and field championships, they also have the youngest team members of any team in the conference.

In his first season as head coach, Jim Crumpton has developed a team made up mostly of physical education majors. "We had no type of recruiting system so most of the girls are walk-ons," says Crumpton.

A top competitor in the high jump is freshman Stacie Kennerly, who hit a personal best of 5-0 this year. Freshman Rose Kalabas holds the school record in the long jump at 17-3. Leading the team in the 400 and 800 meters are sophomores Theresa Meyers and Carla Thompson.

"We have young talent that we are trying to develop," Crumpton said. "I don't have very high expectations for us in the championships, But I do feel the girls have proven themselves as legitimate contenders."
