Highlights

Razorbacks Return to Top: Arkansas won its first outdoor team title since 1999 with a strong showing in the distance events June 11-14 at Sacramento State.

Daniel Lincoln won two events and Alistair Cragg added 18 points to head Arkansas' collection of 59 points. The title is the Razorbacks' 10th outdoor crown overall. The 5,000-meter run was the last running event for Arkansas and it proved to be the clincher as Cragg won the race. Earlier, Cragg finished second in the 10,000-meter run behind Lincoln, who also earned his third straight victory in the 3,000-meter steeplechase. Lincoln was the lone individual to repeat as an event winner and to win more than one.

LSU sprinted to wins in both the 400- and 1,600-meter relays with the same quartet of Kelly Willie, Robert Parham, Pete Coley and Bennie Brazell. It is the first time since the relays were added to the championships in 1964 that the same four runners have won both events in the same meet.

Highlights

Tigers Sweep Titles: LSU registered only one first place, but had enough top performances to win the team title June 11-14 at Sacramento State.

The Tigers earned their first outdoor championship since 2000 and their division-leading 13th overall. Coupled with its 2003 indoor crown, LSU swept the meets for the ninth time in the championships' 22-year history.

LSU's only event win was courtesy of its 400-meter relay unit of Stephanie Durst, Monique Hall, Lolo Jones and Muna Lee. Lee had two of the Tigers' three individual second places in the 100- and 200-meter dashes. South Carolina's Aleen Bailey crossed the finish line first in both events and was the meet's lone double winner.

Stanford's Lauren Fleshman recorded her third consecutive win in the 5,000-meter run. North Carolina's Alice Schmidt (800-meter run), Illinois' Perdita Felicien (100-meter hurdles) and Auburn's Elva Goulbourne (long jump) each won for the second year in a row.
