

Trojan Spikemen Down Olympic Club, Bruins

Southern California won a triangular track meet at the Coliseum yesterday, defeating the national champion Olympic Club of San Francisco and U.C.L.A. Simultaneously the Trojans defeated both teams in separate dual meets. The Clubmen defeated the Bruins.

The three-way score was: Southern California, 65½; Olympic Club, 51; U.C.L.A., 18½. The dual meet results were: S.C., 93-U.C.L.A., 38; S.C., 72-Olympic Club, 58; Olympic Club, 86.9-U.C.L.A., 43.1. One Coliseum and two meet records were broken.

JUMPING DUEL

The high spot of the meet was when Johnny Wilson, the great Trojan high jumper, cleared what had been declared a height of 6ft. 10in. Seconds later Les Steers, young Palo Alto star jumping for the Olympic Club, took off and cleared the same height.

The bar was then measured officially and found to be but 6ft. 9¾in., only ¼ of an inch short of the present accepted world's record. The bar was then placed

at 6ft. 10¾in. but both boys missed their tries at clearing it.

HERD OF KANGAROOS

The high jumpers early indicated they intended to thrill the crowd of 5000 fans when 10 of them cleared 6ft. 4in. for some kind of a record in a three-way meet. The 6ft. 9¾in. height established a new S.C.-U.C.L.A. record, replacing Wilson's 6ft. 5in. made last year. It also broke Mel Walker's 6ft. 8in. Coliseum record, established in the 1939 Pacific Coast Conference-Big Ten meet.

Cornelius Warmerdam easily cleared 14ft. 6in. to win the pole vault and then took three shots

at 15ft. 2 1/4 in., seeking to top his 15ft. mark made at Berkeley a fortnight ago. He cleared the bar each jump but experienced difficulty coming out of his jack-knife and brushed the cross stick off on his way down.

MICKY BEATEN

Barney Willis, Trojan sprinter, proved his injured leg was now completely well by rambling the 220-yard dash in 21.2s., beating his teammate, Mickey Anderson, and Bruin Hal Sinclair, to break the 21.4s. meet record formerly held by Draper, Crane and himself. Willis placed third in the short dash, when Anderson came from behind in the last 10 yards to defeat Sinclair in the comparatively slow time of 9.9s.

Louie Zamperini and Leroy Weed did their usual brother act in the mile run, endeavoring to hit the tape abreast. The judges tagged Weed the winner, however, in the slow time of 4m. 28.7s.

LOUIE NIPPED

Zamperini came back to run the 880 and was nipped by 5 yards when the Olympic Club's McCurdy uncorked a terrific sprint the final 75 yards. The time was 1m. 57.8s.

The single one-two-three sweep of the meet was made by Bruins Turner, Lacefield and Schilling in the broad jump.

The high hurdle race was won easily by Clubman Tom Moore in the fast time of 14.5s. and proved disastrous for Southern California because, although Hommell romped into second place, Ivy Bledsoe pulled up lame in third place. It is believed he will not be fully recovered for the Stanford meet next Saturday. Moore also won the low hurdles with Trojan Laret right

at his shoulder in 23.7s., the fastest time Laret has run this year.

The javelin throw, won by the Olympic Club's Lowell Todd, was far below par for the contestants. The winning throw was but 207ft. 6 1/4 in., two and one-quarter inches ahead of Bob Peoples.

Don McNeil easily won the shot-put and placed second in the discus throw behind Olympian Phil Fox. Howard Upton proved to have too much of a kick finish for the boys in the 440-yard race, coming from behind to win handily. He also ran the last lap for the winning Trojan relay team, nosing out a determined Bruin and ditto Olympian, who finished in a dead heat behind him.

The annual Bruin-Trojan frosh track meet was fitted in between events of the varsity meet and was won by the Trojans, 72 to 59.
