

Troy Routs Bruins; Weight Marks Fall

Southern California engaged in its yearly workout at the expense of the UCLA spikesters yesterday, romping to a 95-36 victory at the Coliseum as two meet records were shattered and another tied.

The record breaking followed plan exactly, big Sim Iness raising the discus mark by more than 12 feet with a 174ft. 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. twirl and Parry O'Brien improving on his own meet standard in the shot with a 54ft. 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ in. push.

Davis Doubles

And Jack Davis, who with Iness and O'Brien represent Troy's best bets for Olympic honors, scored his customary hurdle double and equaled Dick Attlesey's meet record in the highs at 14.2. His low-hurdle mark was 23.2.

Even though the Bruins failed to score as many points as expected, which is somewhat of an annual occurrence in this meet, the running races were consistently close and pretty consistently productive of good performances.

SC's Art Garcia started his distance double with a 4:18.9 mile victory, lagging behind Chuck Phillips of the Bruins for three and a half yards, taking the lead and then having to hold off Phillips' closing rush which left him only two feet behind at the tape.

Startling 440 Sweep

The Trojans scored a startling 440 sweep which found favored John Bradley third and UCLA's Jack Sage unplaced.

Running in lanes all the way, around two turns, Bradley was on the pole and Sage in the second lane. But Roger Hendrix of the Trojans, farther out, stole a big early lead. Bradley didn't show quite his usual speed for 220 and as they came into the stretch it was Hendrix on top, then Bradley, with SC Sophomore Jim Lea charging past both of them to win by four yards with Hendrix nipping Bradley for second.

Lea's time of 48.5 hasn't been beaten by anybody hereabouts but Oxy's John Barnes.

9.9 Century Win

The 100 saw Rod Richard testing the Coliseum track the first time this season and over the

hard clay surface the Bruin star could do only 9.9. Al Mejia was a good strong second, only two feet back, but he pulled up lame from a leg-muscle cramp and was scratched from the 220. The Trojans hope and believe it's only a temporary thing.

But in the 220 SC's Norm Stocks surprised Richard—giving him his first sprint defeat of the year—by more than a yard margin in 21.6 around the curve.

After Don Hangen bounced back to form with an easy 1:56.4 half-mile victory for the Bruins, Garcia completed his double with a 9.36 two mile, Phillips again making it a race and finishing only two yards back.

Other Sweeps

SC swept the discus, shot-put, low hurdles and high jump as well as 440.

UCLA's Len Eilers, who won the pole vault at 13ft. 6in., later cleared 14ft. when the event was concluded. George Brown gave the Bruins their only other first with a 24ft. 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ in. fliers in the broad jump.
